The **Integrated Family Violence Program** is primarily an in-home service for families where domestic violence has been identified. It focuses on all family members including the child, the parent who is the survivor of domestic violence and the batterer. Core services include safety planning for the survivor and the child, trauma focused work with children, dyad-based interventions focused on repairing, and healing relationships and batterer interventions. The core length of service for this model is 3 months.

This Agency acts as a service hub for the coordination and delivery of key clinical services by developing a treatment plan that integrates domestic violence specific interventions across existing child and adult systems. These interventions include safety planning with the survivor and the children; victim advocacy services that integrate case planning and child welfare concerns with adult court processes and efforts to hold batterers accountable; coordinating and assisting with referrals to trauma informed services for children, and batterer interventions. The common focal point of these services and activities are the safety and well-being of the child(ren) and family members.
